Discuss

- Imagine that you were having a conversation with a new Christian who has very little exposure to the Bible. How would you use 1 Peter 1:13–2:3 as a blueprint to explain to them how a Christian should live?
- Christians sometimes say that the imperative (command) is based on the indicative (identity), which means that our obedience is grounded in what God has already done for us. Do you see examples of that in 1 Peter 1:13–2:3?

- Imagine a Christian listening to the sermon and expressing in one way or another, "I've heard this before." What would you want to express to that person about how they should respond to familiar biblical teaching?
