The cosmic impact of Easter: God wins & Satan loses (Acts 10.34-43)

Central Thought: Easter made a cosmic impact: God won, and Satan lost.

- 1. For biblical context: Read Matt 28.16-20 and Acts 1.6-11
- 2. For more immediate context: Read Acts 10.1-33 (Story of the visions of Cornelius and Peter) (Acts 10 is longest story in Acts; emphasizes the importance of the episode (cf. Acts 11.1-18).)
- 3. Read the sermon passage: Acts 10.34-43. Note that Peter is preaching to a Gentile crowd. This record in Acts signifies the gospel being unleashed to the Nations (cf. Matt 28 & Acts 1)
- 4. Note in the passage that Peter is proclaiming the good news of salvation in Jesus:
- V34-35: God desires a relationship with all people (cf. 1 Tim 2.4; 4.10) is no partiality with God V36-39: God sent Jesus to do good, healing all who were oppressed by the devil
- The explicit meaning of that is literal: some were literally rescued from demonic oppression.

 Yet, we realize that everyone who is saved is rescued from the oppression of sin (Satan)

 Implication: God sent Jesus to die, so that sinners would be saved
- V40-41: God raised Jesus from the dead; and He appeared to many witnesses (cf. 1 Cor 15.4-8) V42-43: God commanded His apostles (us) to testify to resurrection of Jesus (Matt 28; Acts 1)
- What is the testimony that we are to give? Our witness is the good news of the gospel (v43): anyone who believes in [Jesus] receives forgiveness of sins through His name (cf. Rom 10.13)
- 5. To help us remember how important it is to be forgiven, I shared two passages
 - Read Luke 13.1-5: We cannot know God's purpose for the plague called covid 19 We can herald Jesus' warning: unless people repent they will be separated from God forever
 - Read Rev 20.1-5: Everyone will be judged by Jesus (cf. Acts 10.42)

 Those whose names are not written in *Book of Life* (those who aren't saved), will be condemned to an eternal separation from God
- 6. In the 4th truth about the real meaning of Easter, I said that Easter calls for a response to God
- 7. So, for application, I suggested we use Acts 10.34-43 (and other passages) to tell our unsaved family/friends the real meaning of Easter & invite them to respond to God's offer of salvation
