"The Prophesied Messiah" Luke 24:13–49 Easter Sunday, March 31, 2024

The Prophesied Messiah

- "He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." (Genesis 3:15)
- "For you will not abandon my soul to Sheol, or let your holy one see corruption." (Psalm 16:10)
- "They have pierced my hands and feet—I can count all my bones—they stare and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots." (Psalm 22:16–18)
- "Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God." (Psalm 31:5)
- "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." (Psalm 118:22)
- "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:6)
- "After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him." (Hosea 6:2)
- Lesson #1: Because Jesus is the prophesied Messiah, his death and resurrection prove his identity.
- Lesson #2: Because Jesus is the prophesied Messiah, his death and resurrection are his redemption.
- Lesson #3: Because Jesus is the prophesied Messiah, his death and resurrection is taught by the whole Bible.
- Lesson #4: Because Jesus is the prophesied Messiah, his death and resurrection compels us to mission.
- Lesson #5: Because Jesus is the prophesied Messiah, his death and resurrection is revealed by God.
