Like Father, Like Son

The next generation has to learn to walk with God by faith.

"The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15)

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10:13)

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9)

"You are my friends if you do what I command you." (John 15:14)

"We all stumble in many ways." (James 3:2)

"I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

"I want you to know that your mother and I sense there is a struggle for the soul of your life. And there is no halfway. Either you're going to have to accept Jesus Christ and what he says and obey him and follow him, or you'll have to reject him. There is no middle ground." (Franklin Graham)
