A recipe for joy: doing God's will and watching God work (John 4.27-54; 01-31-21am)

Central thought: There is great joy in talking with others about Jesus (36)
I. There is joy in sharing the gospel: the outcome is up to God (31-38)
A. Doing Kingdom work is spiritually nourishing (31-35)
B. Sharing the gospel with non-believers leads to joy (36-38)
II. The power of your story in helping someone believe in the gospel (39-45)
A. The woman's experience with Jesus causes others to believe in Jesus (39)
B. The words of Jesus sealed the faith of many more Samaritans (39-42)
III. Authentic faith is usually a process, not an event (46-54)
Summary for Chapter 4
1. There is no person or ethnic group beyond the scope of God's plan to save
2. There is great joy in talking with others about Jesus; being obedient to sow & reap fosters rejoicing
3. A personal testimony is given power when it puts a seeker in the presence of Jesus (through the Bible)
Invite: If you are interested in finding out about Jesus, do 2 things:

(1) Go to someone who knows Jesus and ask that person to tell you what Jesus has done in his/her life

Ask them a hard question: what difference has it made in your life since you gave your life to God?

(2) Read the Gospel of John. See what Jesus did; see what Jesus said; see what impact He had in that day Ask God to show you how He can have that same impact on your life today.
