Pressing on; Not there yet; Straining for the Prize: Glory is coming! (Phil 3.12-21; 05-17-20am)

Central Thought: Embracing the need to keep growing in Christ

I. Run the race to get the prize (12-16)

Not a competition against others; not about who grows fastest; it's about enduring to become like Jesus.

- A. Keep making progress (12-14) Four statements about spiritual progress (pressing on)
 - 1. Spiritual progress is the expectation for every believer (12, 14) (cf.17) *Press on in Christ* (2x)
 - 2. Spiritual progress identifies us with Jesus (12) Christ Jesus has made me His own (cf. Lk 9.23)
 - 3. Giving full effort to spiritual progress (*straining forward*) helps prevent lingering in the past (13) *forget what's behind* (cf. v4-6)
 - 4. Pressing on pursuing spiritual progress is what it means to follow the call of God (14)

Six reasons why we must keep making progress

- 1. Because an Apostle of Christ models that lifestyle is great reason for us to do the same thing (12-14)
- 2. Because we're not yet fully mature in Christ (perfect) not consider I have made it my own (12-13)
- 3. Because *perfection* is what Jesus is and we want to be like Jesus (12)
- 4. Because perfection lies at the end of our race our goal is to finish (13-14)
- 5. Because the *goal* is to make it to the end and receive the *prize* (13-14)
- 6. Because God has *called us* to run the race so we will get the *prize* (14) (cf. 2 Tim 4.7-8)
- B. Stay on the right course (15-16)
 - 1. Pressing on for the prize is a sign of maturity (15) those who are mature think this way
 - 2. Staying on the right track is critical to making it to the finish *hold true to what we have attained* (1.27; 2.12-13)

II. Choose good models and follow their example (17-21)

- A. God has given us examples to help us faithfully grow in Christ (17)
 - 1. Godly models show us the right way to live (17) (2.5-8; 2.19-30; 3.4-11)
 - 2. Not all models are good models (not all *walk according to Paul's example*)
- B. Be careful to choose the right example (18-19)
 - 1. Warning is obvious don't look to unbelievers as models of faithful life (18) enemies of the cross
 - 2. Extended warning in v19 don't seek to imitate [those who live for] *earthly things* (19) v19 reveals the danger of following *enemies of the cross*)

their end is destruction – that expression identifies them as separated from God their god is their belly – not just about food; they seek to pursue every appetite or desire they glory in their shame – not only pursue ungodly pleasures, they are proud of their ungodliness

Apply: Need to set up biblical filters to help us determine our friendships & our loyalties

Parents – in the home, you do the guiding; and you guide 'best' by modeling what you teach/expect

Get help – invite the counsel of others to help you choose your relationships

- C. Good models demonstrate a longing for heaven and a desire to be like Jesus (20-21)
 - 1. Set your mind on heaven (not on earthly things) (20) citizenship is in heaven

When Christ returns to call us home, we will see Him as He is (1 Cor 13.12)

Yet, even while we *await* Him, we are already *becoming like Him* (2 Cor 3.18) And when He comes, He will *complete His work in us* (Phil 1.6); and we **WILL** *be like Him* (1 Jn 3.2)

2. Point your spiritual energies toward becoming like Christ (21) (cf. 10-11)

Here's Paul's promise:

Jesus is *Savior*, *Lord*, *Christ* (20); He is the One who will secure our resurrection
He is the omnipotent Son of God who will *transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body* (21)
He is the Reigning King over all creation who is *enabled even to subject <u>all things</u> to Himself* (21)
